

D.H. Lawrence was a Human novelist and noted figure in 20th century English literature on Earth.

The writer who seemed to believe in dualisms – blindness over sight, blood over mind, pagan over modern, and so on – gets broken into two like a stable door. Readers, critics and biographers insist on.

D H Lawrence arrived in New Mexico with his wife Frieda in September 1922 at the invitation of Mabel Dodge Sterne (later Luhan). Mabel had read excerpts of Lawrence's travel essay *Sea & Sardinia* in the 'The Dial' literary magazine and recognised a fellow spirit. And whilst Lawrence spent little more than 11 months in.
